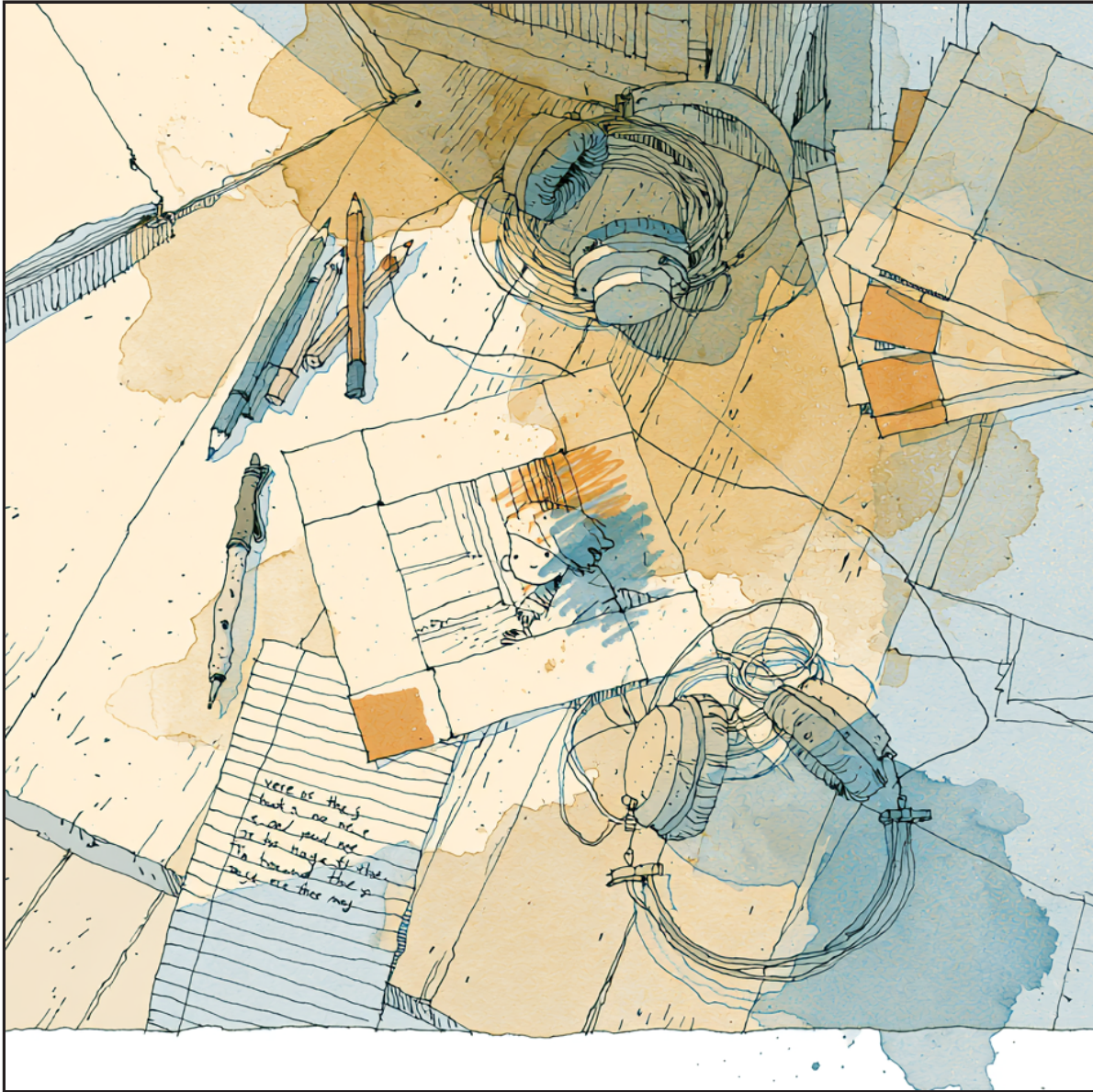

# Start it right.

*how to use this page*

## For you — the parent

- This is a guide, not a worksheet. Print it once, keep it by the table, don't reprint.
- Your one job: same time, every day, no negotiating. The discipline is yours to hold.
- Let her pick. Read the lyrics first if you want a say — then step back. Her taste isn't the point; the reps are.

## For your kid

- Pick a song you love. Yours — not a teaching one.
- Make it a record. Give your single a cover. Draw it on any paper.
- Copy a chunk a day onto your own lined paper. Stop mid-line — tomorrow it's already started.

# Liner notes.

*how to use this page*

## For you — the parent

- When the song runs out, sit with her five minutes and talk it through.
- Naming what she loved — and what's next — is where the practice sticks. Don't skip it.
- This half is hers. No wrong answers. You're just the one asking.

## For your kid

- Which line did you love most?
- Why did you pick this song?
- How many stars — honest ones?
- What's the next single?

She writes her liner notes on her own paper too. Keep her singles in a stack — a few songs in, it's an album.
